1. Fundamentals of the Revitalisation and Re-Energisation of RAAs Campaign

- A structured reform initiative led by the **Office of COS&HOPS**.
- Established to restore **effectiveness, visibility, accountability, and impact** in the execution of regulatory mandates.
- Anchored on structured reporting, supervision, peer learning, and continuous improvement.

Scale of the Regulatory Ecosystem

- 125 RAAs
- 38 State Departments
- 38 Standing Committees

This is a **whole-of-government regulatory reform initiative**, not an isolated reporting exercise.

2. What does the Campaign Seek to Achieve?

- i. Strengthen the **execution of core regulatory mandates**.
- ii. Improve **quality, timeliness, and consistency** of regulatory service delivery.
- iii. Enhance **visibility and credibility** of RAAs to citizens and stakeholders.
- iv. Identify and address **institutional, operational, and regulatory gaps**.
- v. Promote **coordination, synergy, and avoidance of duplication** across regulators.
- vi. Provide an **evidence base** for administrative, policy, and legislative interventions.

3. Who are the Key Actors in the Regulatory Space

1 Office of the Chief of Staff and Head of the Public Service;



38 Principal Secretaries each heading a State Department that has RAAs under its ward as outlined in Executive Order No. 2 of 2025;



38 Standing Committees on the Revitalization and Re-energization of RAAs in each State Department and chaired by a Senior officer designated by the respective Principal Secretary; and



125 RAAs each headed by a CEO who is answerable to their respective Principal Secretary. [SCs to ensure the on-boarding of any new Regulators, or report on exit of a Regulator in the State Departments]



The Citizens/Stakeholders

4. Current Stage of the Campaign and Expectations

- Third year of implementation.
- Shift from establishment and diagnostics to measurement, evaluation, and impact.
- Use of the revised Reporting Tool (Nov 2025 / March 2026).

What Is Required Now?

Regulatory Authorities & Agencies

- i. Submit accurate and complete **Bi-Annual Reports by 31 March 2026**.
- ii. Demonstrate progress, corrective actions, and outcomes.

Standing Committees

- i. Engage RAAs using the Reporting Tool as a supervision instrument.
- ii. Submit **Analytical Reports to COS&HOPS by 9 April 2026**.
- iii. Escalate systemic and cross-cutting challenges.

Overall Expectation: Evidence of improved regulatory performance and citizen impact.
